4; ABC Spearwood Steps Group. Jon GSR - The group numbers are between 8 - 15 members per week. The group takes in between \$40 to \$60 per week and donates monthly to the 50:30:10:10 plan (Approx \$150-\$200 per month) and will continue to make regular donations when the funds are available. We have a small prudent reserve for coffee, literature when needed and other expenses. All our service positions are filled (treasurer, secretary, GSR and smaller roles such as greeter).

We regularly get newcomers to our meeting, and they are always given a beginner's pack and some phone numbers (men for men and women for women) when they first arrive, and we also encourage sponsorship. We recently purchased a 12 Concepts for World Service banner at our meeting to promote the notion of service in AA.

The group has six home group members, with most having service positions. We have members ranging from 40 years of sobriety to newcomers at the meeting and there is a good atmosphere. All-in-all the meeting is well attended, and the group is going strong.

When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of A.A. always to be there. And for that: I am responsible.
