<u>Treatment and Corrections Report</u> – Grace

Bunbury Regional Prison –

I went to Father Brian's house to discuss AA getting more involved in meetings at prison. He is concerned how the meetings will continue once he can no longer work and stressed the importance of it being AA, not NA, and there needs to be AA members running it. He currently holds multiple meetings across 3 different sections of the prison (main part with multiple units, pre-release unit, and unit 5). I explained to him that with the amount of members we have that would be able to be of service, its not realistic that we could be involved in all of the meetings. Unit 5 has a program run

by Palmerston called STEPS for prisoners with AOD problems. I suggested we start with a meeting in there which he agreed with. Brian will speak to the staff member in charge of that program. We will ask about times, clearances, ect. He also mentioned we could have a regular roster plus one off guest speakers e.g. ex prisoners who are still involved in aa and working a program. He mentioned some concern with attendance as 85% of prisoners are in for drug related offences, I told him that if we can help one person, it's worth it. I will contact him for an update.

Cyrenian House – Nannup TC

The Nannup TC meeting is still running fortnightly with AA members attending. I have reached out to the TC to hopefully get approval for AA members to come out every week instead of once a fortnight. We are bringing biscuits and the residents are always so thankful when we come out. They have stopped reading living sober when AA members attend so there is more time for sharing.

Palmerston – Beela Valley TC

The Beela Valley meeting is still running well with fluctuating attendance. Only stage ones are able to attend which impacts the attendance. Members doing service put in to fund a chip order and some have been anonymously donated.

GSR reports

Busselton group GSR report - Grace

Attendance is very strong at the moment with 18-25 members at both monday and thursday meetings. We have just voted in new secretaries for all 3 meetings and are financially well. We get regular newcomers and have noticed more ex-residents from Nannup rehab attending after we started participating in their in-house meeting via SW district. Our group is participating in conference topics, and a separate committee has been formed for the 2026 Busselton Roundup Camp.

Planning for camp is going well. We have 4 committee members with all relevant positions filled, we have secured our venue and dates which are 20-22nd March 2026, Busselton Christian Brethren Campsite, 172 Caves Road, Siesta Park, 6280. Our next meeting will be held on the 21st of September at 5pm on the Busselton zoom account, all members are welcome to come and observe and if appropriate, pick up a service position and join our committee.
