We also discuss the contributions at each meeting and decide what the ratio is. GSR, CSR, Area, District. Usually 50/30/10/10

We also have a regular monthly road trip and choose a meeting or 2 to attend as a group. This month we attended the Bunbury 78th Anniversary.

2: ABC Spearwood Steps Group. John R

The group numbers are between 8 - 12 members per week, which is a drop from recently, possibly due to winter. The group takes in between \$40 to \$60 per week and donates monthly to the 50:30:10:10 plan (Approx \$150-\$200 per month) and will continue to make regular donations when the funds are available.
